Sustainability

The PE Premium has helped to bring about a transformational change to the culture of the school around physical activity.

- CPD opportunities have up-skilled both teaching and non-teaching staff. They are now more confident and competent so that higher quality teaching and learning will continue.
- PE and Sport are now firmly embedded in the culture of the school. Participation in extra-curricular activities and events is considered the norm.
- Resources that have been purchased to support delivery of a broader range of activities will enable these activities to continue.
- Pupils have developed lifelong skills such as confidence, empathy, fair play and resilience through participation in physical activity
- Fewer instances of low level poor behaviour during break and lunchtimes
- Pupils understand the importance of physical activity as a contributor to health and well being
- Previously disengaged pupils now enjoy some form of physical activity
- Termly meetings take place with the Partnership manager to evaluate the impact of the funding and help to identify the added value of the funding and identify other areas of need to enhance overall provision.
- Clear talent pathways are established including club links.

Next steps

- Audit pupils around physical activity offer – what do they want to see?
- Ensure that all pupils have extra-curricular physical activity opportunities
- To sustain current competitive opportunities and become involved in new inclusive opportunities offered.
- Audit staff CPD requirements
- Continue to provide CPD opportunities for staff and embed CPD through classroom practice
- Increase capacity for more clubs e.g. breakfast clubs
- To target pupils who are not currently engaged e.g. Change 4 Life Club
- PE Apprentice to provide structured play opportunities during break and lunch times
- PE apprentice to work with young people to develop leadership skills

- PE apprentice to monitor and support young leaders when they undertake roles of official, organiser
- Develop a School Games Organising Crew to give pupil voice regarding PE and School Sport and to support intra school events and competitions
- Continue to provide a broad and balanced extra-curricular programme to meet the needs and interests of all pupils.
- Increase the number and range of Inclusive competitions and events
- To retain Gold School Games Mark Award
- To continue to celebrate PE and School Sport
- To consider the introduction of the Daily Mile
- To explore ways to ensure that all pupils are active for 30 minutes per day
- To monitor and track all pupils regarding physical activity
