Accessibility Plan 2023-25

Purpose of Plan

The purpose of this plan is to demonstrate how St Benedict's Catholic Primary intends, over time, to increase the accessibility of our school for disabled pupils, staff, parents/carers and visitors.

Definition of Disability

A person has a disability if he or she has a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long term adverse effect on his or her ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

Areas of Responsibilities

- Improving access to the physical environment of school to increase the extent to which disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services, which includes improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education.
- Increasing access for disabled pupils to the school curriculum, which includes teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school, such as participation in after school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits.
- Improving the delivery of written information to disabled pupils, which is provided in writing to pupils who are not disabled, e.g. handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about school events. The information should take account of the pupils' disabilities and the preferred format of pupils and parents, and be made available within a reasonable timeframe.

This School aims to treat all pupils, prospective pupils, staff, governors and other stakeholders favourably and, wherever possible, takes reasonable steps to avoid placing anyone at a substantial disadvantage. School aims to work closely with disabled pupils, their families and any relevant outside agencies in order to remove or minimize any potential barriers to learning, which puts them at a disadvantage, but allows them to learn, achieve and participate fully in school life. The school is active in promoting positive attitudes to disabled people in school.

Contextual Information

Since the school was built there has been significant investment in refurbishment which is now to a high standard. However there are limitations inherent within the building structure as there areas where there are a number of steps inside the school and ramped access to support access outside of the building. We currently have no car park facilities. The school is located on a busy road. We have one accessible toilet.

Current Range of Known Disabilities

The school has children with a range of disabilities that include moderate and specific learning disabilities. We have 228 children and 32 staff. To our knowledge we have no disabled staff or children at present who require disability aids.

We have a few children who have asthma and all staff are aware of these children. Inhalers are kept in the classrooms and a record of use is noted.

Some children have food allergies or intolerances / cultural food choices.

All medical information is collated and available to staff. The Office staff coordinate this and all First Aiders are aware.

We have competent First Aiders who hold current First Aid certificates.

All medication is kept in a central safe and secure location for easy access for First Aiders. Administration of medicine consent forms are completed by parents/carers outlining the illness and amount and time of medication. All medication that is given is recorded.

School has 1 Defibrillator on site. All staff have been trained in the use of this equipment and are aware of its location.
